



Guidelines for Nominating a Significant Tree

Scope

For a tree to be placed on the Significant Tree Register a tree must:

- a) Be within the municipal boundary of the City of Gosnells,
- b) Be on land owned or managed by the City of Gosnells; this includes the verges of roads maintained by the City, Parks, freehold land owned by the City or land over which the City has a Land Management Order.
- c) Have characteristics that are recognized as being significant due to its:
 - a. Physical form – including size, age, and vitality,
 - b. Landscape value – position in the landscape, visual contribution,
 - c. Heritage or Cultural value – association with community custom or history,
 - d. Botanical value – species, rarity,
 - e. Location – feasibility of protection and longevity.
 - f. Community Significance – history to local groups/families

Selection Process

First check the Significant Tree Register to see if the tree is already listed. The register is available on the City's website.

If the tree is not already listed, complete the online nomination form.

Each tree nominated for inclusion in the Significant Tree Register will be inspected and scored by City Arborists against the five criteria listed in c) above.

If the tree's scores sufficiently it will be added to the Significant Tree Register.

The nominator of the tree will be advised of the reasons for its inclusion or non-inclusion on the register.
