Give food waste recycling a go

The City of Gosnells is set to trial an innovative recycling program that turns food waste into sought-after products such as fertiliser, and we need your help.

The process uses insect larvae to convert food waste into high-quality fertiliser and for high-protein animal feed.

The three-year pilot will involve just 2,000 households within the City of Gosnells on an opt-in basis.

Residents who opt in to the trial will receive a 140-litre burgundy bin, as well as a 5-litre benchtop caddy with compostable liners to collect food waste.

Food scraps that can be disposed of in the GOsFO bins include vegetables, fruit, meat, bread, baked goods, tea, coffee, takeaway food and leftovers.

During the trial, the burgundy GOsFO bins will be collected weekly, with the City expected to process about 5 tonnes of food scraps each week, which equates to around 780 tonnes of processed food waste over the three-year pilot program.

The program is expected to begin later this year, with participants to pay \$47 for the remainder of 2024/25 and \$80 a year for subsequent years.
