Pull on your boots, it's time to Hoedown

Grab your hat and get ready to scoot on down to Harmony Fields in Maddington for the return of the City's much-loved Hoedown at Harmony.

The free event is on from 5pm to 9pm on **Saturday 7 March**, featuring plenty of activities and entertainment for the whole family – no tickets required.

Get on your feet and have a go at line dancing, or sit back to enjoy live music, including Bootscoot'n Betty + Friends, Class Act Performers and Step 2 It Line Dancing.

Headline act The Rough Housers will share their love of rockabilly with the crowd, with an energetic performance by the trio featuring original music and old favourites.

There will also be inflatable axe throwing, cow milking, children's pony rides, a bucking sheep, craft activities, Gosnells Lions Club ride-in train and free carnival rides.

Pack a picnic to enjoy or grab a bite from the food trucks. The event is strictly alcohol free.

Parking is limited, so avoid the hassle by moseying down on foot, hitching a ride on public transport, or saddling up the iron horse (that is, ride your bike).

Hoedown at Harmony is supported by Lotterywest and Perth Airport.



Anzac commemorations

Anzac commemorations have been expanded in the City of Gosnells next month, with a series of events at Don Russell Performing Arts Centre to complement the Gosnells RSL's annual March, Dawn Service and Gunfire Breakfast. Events include a stage production of 21 Hearts, which tells the story of Vivian Bullwinkel and the nurses of Vyner Brook. There is also a talk by historian Neville Browning with screening of the film Gallipoli, poppy-themed Art With a Glass and Fred Smith presenting Unforgotten: Songs of Australians at War. Sports centre takes shape

Sports enthusiasts can almost start warming up, with construction at Langford Indoor Sports Centre well underway. Cladding has been installed on the building's exterior, the roof is complete, windows are being installed and the building is nearing lockup.

Once complete, the \$12.5 million state-of-the-art centre will be the City's first indoor multicourt and multisport facility. The project is jointly funded by the City of Gosnells, plus Federal and State governments.
